Babies are born under the water

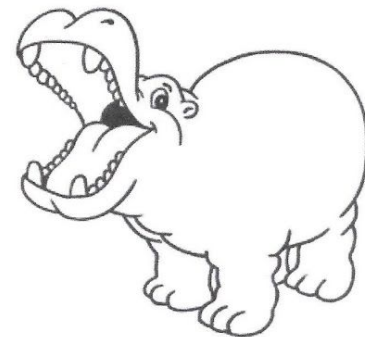
There are 125,000-250,000 remaining in the wild.

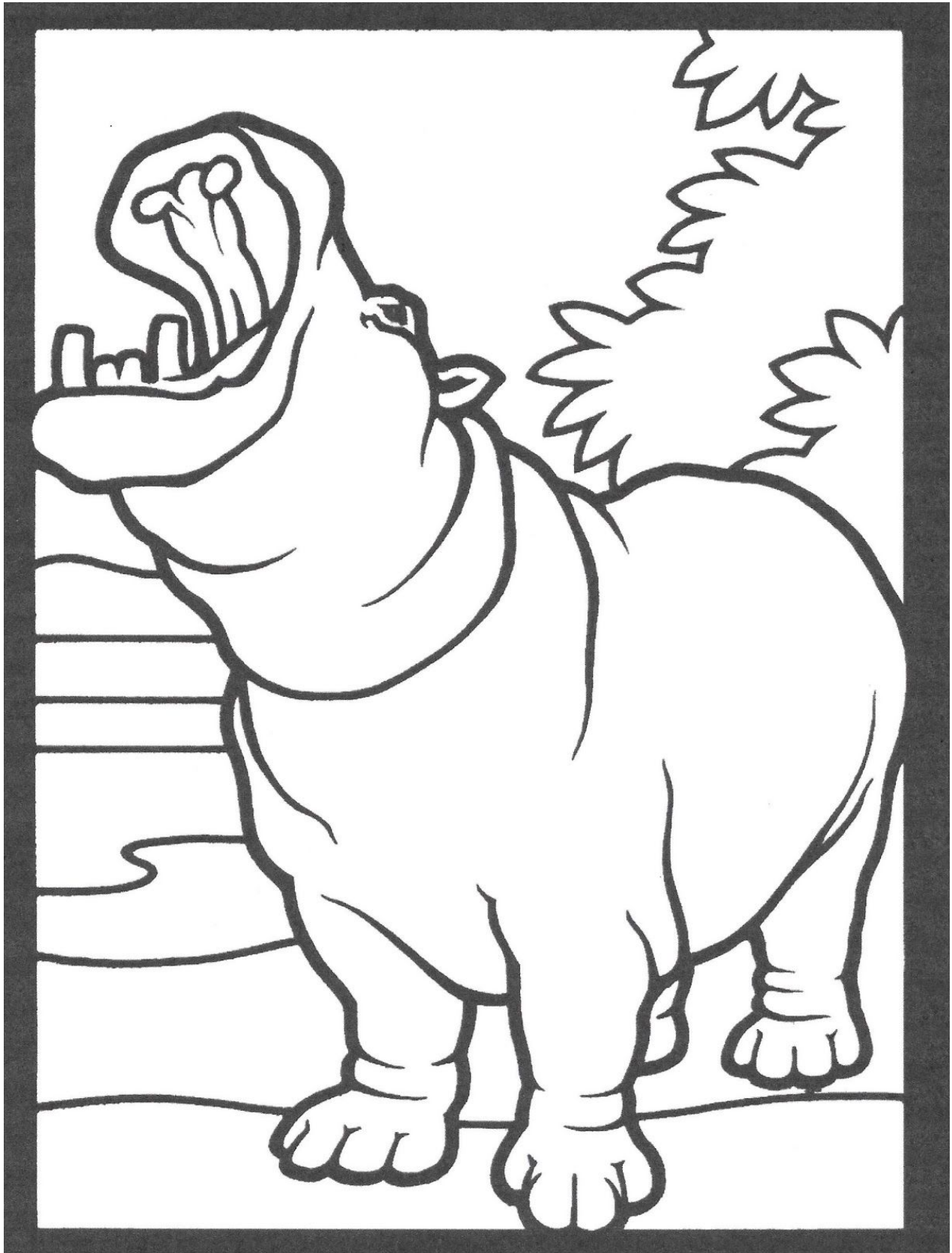

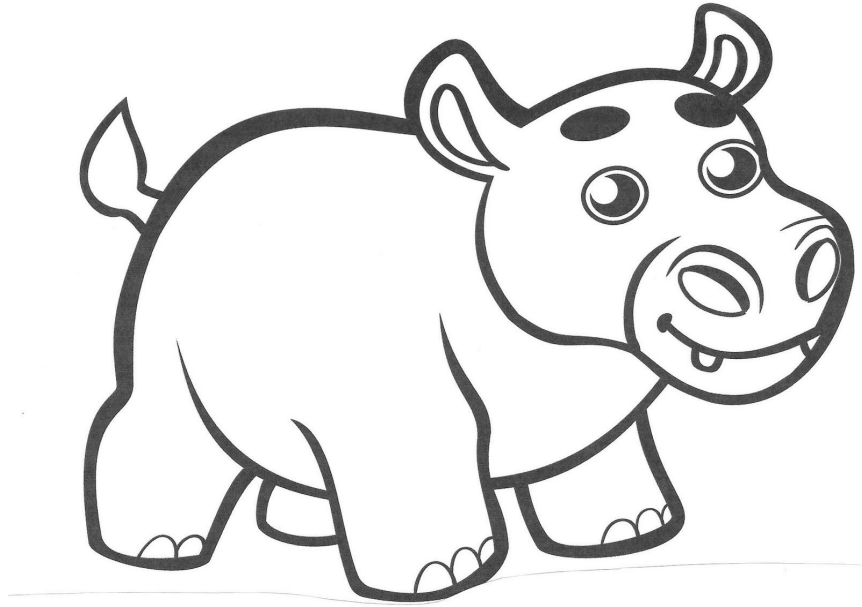
Make as many words as you can out of the word, Hippopotamus. Use each letter only one time except for the 'p' - can use 3 times; and the 'o' can use 2 times.
